## MAPPING CHINA LIVING IN THE REFORM ERA

Mapping China is a project about ordinary people's memories of China. The exhibition Mapping China: Living in the Reform Era is the first part of the project. It avoids political factors as much as possible, trying to present a true and objective China from the perspective of ordinary people.

This exhibition includes works by 17 photographers, all of whom were active during China's Reform and Opening Up period since 1978. Their works provide a piece of intuitive and visible Chinese history.

For more than 40 years, their works have always maintained the public's perspective, recording images that are inseparable from social changes, history, and human nature. From the opinions of the public, they record the living conditions and ways of existence of ordinary people engulfed by the reform trend.

This exhibition brings together over 100 photographs, films, literatures, and objects. All the photographs and films were taken during the reform period, showing every aspects of social life.
