THE DRAFT HOUSE

43 Goodge Street

This intimate little pub is one of the small groups of Public Houses created by innovators, The Draft House. Their aim is to do for beer what our discerning tastes have done for food and wine over the past twenty years. And their dedication to every bottle's provenance is definitely impressive; the extraordinary range of strange and wonderful brews includes this exceedingly refreshing White Ale brewed with pure Icelandic water.



15-17 Charlotte Street

The Financial Times calls this hotel, "Charming, beautiful, witty, friendly, stylish and very cool," and who are we to argue with that? Each of the bedrooms and suites has recieved designer Kit Kemp's magic touch, exemplfying the hotel's 'Bloomsbury Group' theme (complete with works of art by the most famous British artists of the period), and The Oscar Bar serves brunch, afternoon tea, dinner and cocktails with bold art deco-style murals as the backdrop. We'd recommend popping in for a decadent Afternoon Tea or perhaps even joining the hotel's Sunday Night Film Club which meets in the state-ofthe-art screening room. Either way, the place perfectly captures the literary elegance of the group that once included Virginia Woolf, John Maynard Keynes, E.M. Forster and Lytton Strachey.

28 Charlotte Street

This year marks the gallery's 25th anniversary! Since opening her first gallery in Fitzrovia in 1988 Rebecca has championed Non-Western and unique artistic traditions - the current exhibition explores the optical effects of colour.

HEALS

196 Tottenham Court Road

Heals, Fitzrovia, is more than the average designer furniture department store, with regular food tastings, demonstrations and events (such as Out of the Dark, a salvaged furniture enterprise, popping up on 24 and 31 Aug). Although if it is innovative interior pieces that you're after, invest in this Dedon Dala Lounge Chair (£2,495) to relax into during the last days of summer.

37 Charlotte Street

When it comes to Japanese food, Roka knocks highstreet sushi favourites out the park, with the tasting menu alone encompassing such luxuries as seabass sashimi, crayfish dumplings and oscietra caviar. The focal point of the restaurant is the robata grill where seafood, poultry, meat and vegetables are prepared in full view of diners. In summer, spill out into the alfresco seating and at night, head upstairs to Shochu Lounge for Japanese influenced cocktails.



LOAF CAFE

93 Tottenham Court Road

This newly opened cafe is a cross-breed of the New York style coffee shop and old-school British caff. Offering something completely different to the high street chains, Loaf manages to fit hipster-retro decor, home cooking (including a whole section of the menu dedicated to the humble 'Grilled Cheese') and its young creative team, all inside its little glass-fronted store.
